Sight Words-

Sight word club is designed for students K-2 who would like extra reinforcement of sight words while having fun! Beginning readers use a lot of different ways to become more fluent readers. One of the most important ways to do that is to be able to read and recognize sight words. In this club we will focus on learning primary sight words in a variety of different ways. Some examples of club activities may include: board games, interactive Promethean Board activities, art, sign language, body spelling, and relay races. Students will work with small groups and the teacher throughout the club time in an effort to reach all our student's learning styles.

Board Games-

The board game club will meet every Tuesday after school. Students will be able to come play a diverse selection of board games recreationally. Many of the games will promote the formation of strategies, teamwork, and critical thinking.

Brain Teaser Puzzles-
